Learn to prioritize questions based on their difficulty level and allocate time accordingly. 6. **Mock Tests and Analysis**: Taking regular mock tests to simulate the actual exam environment. Analyze your performance after each mock test to identify strengths and weaknesses. Focus on improving weak areas and refining your test-taking strategy.
