- **National Cancer Awareness Week-** National Cancer Awareness Week was commemorated from 7th November to 14th November with dedicated efforts to create awareness regarding different types of cancers. In India alone, nearly 1.1 million new cases are being reported annually. Throughout this week there were regular posts on multiple social media platforms to recount the symptoms, advantages of early detection as well as the medications available for different types of cancers which includes uterine cancer, ovarian cancer, breast cancer, prostate cancer and concluding with blood cancer.








## Uterine Cancer

It is the most common cancer occurring within a woman's reproductive system. Uterine cancer is the abnormal growth of the cells that comprise uterine tissue, forming tumour.



## Ovarian Cancer

Ovarian cancer is the growth of cells that form in the ovaries. The cells multiply quickly and can invade and destroy healthy body tissues.

## Prostate Cancer

- Cancer in the prostate, a small walnut sized gland that produces seminal fluids in males is called prostate cancer.
- Some types of prostate cancer grow slowly and monitoring is recommended, other cases can be more aggressive and require radiation as well.

## Breast Cancer

Breast cancer is a condition in which cells in the breast multiply uncontrollably, causing a tumor. There are several types of breast cancer and each type is determined by the type of cell in the body. As you get older and acquire weight, your chances of having breast cancer rise.




## Blood Cancer

In blood cancers, the normal blood cell development process is interrupted by uncontrolled growth of an abnormal type of blood cell. These abnormal blood cells, or cancerous cells, prevent your blood from performing many of its functions, like fighting off infections or preventing serious bleeding.
