The Department of Computer Science and Engineering organized a one-week short-term course on "Effective Teaching Learning using Social Media" from 27th May to 31st May, 2024. There were 62 participants from MSIT and other colleges of Delhi. The FDP was facilitated by the National Institute of Technical Teachers Training and Research (NITTTR) Chandigarh, with MSIT serving as one of the remote centers.



Esteemed speakers of the course are Dr. Rama chhabra, Dr. Jagriti saini, Dr. Gaurav kumar, Dr. Sunit dutt, Dr. Amandeep Kaur, Dr. Hitesh and Dr. Suditi Jindal. Here's a breakdown of the key points covered in the report.

Inaugural Session: The STC commenced with an inaugural session on Monday, 27th May, 2024. Course coordinator, Dr. Rama Chhabra welcomed the attendees. All the remote centers' coordinators introduced themselves. The course coordinator briefed about the contents, highlighting the scope, objectives, and relevance of this program for the teaching-learning process.

Sessions and Topics Covered: The STC included various sessions covering topics related to effective teaching learning. On day 1 of STC, Course coordinator and speaker Dr. Rama Chhabra highlights the role and importance of social media in education. Mr. Hitesh Gulati explained about LinkedIn for greater visibility, credibility and networking. On day 2, session was based on the integration of modern social media platforms like blogs, Twitter, chatgpt, Facebook, WhatsApp with our traditional teaching learning skills for knowledge dissemination and modern methodologies like blended learning and flipped classroom. Day 3 session was on the effective usage of MOODLE, challenges for incorporating social media in teaching learning and strategies to overcome these challenges. On day 4, diversified AI chatbots, tools for teaching and learning activities were introduced. Presentation of the participants was conducted to highlight the present status of using social media in the institute, opportunities, challenges, strategies to overcome the challenges in incorporating social media in teaching and learning social media in teaching and learning. Day 5, the last day of STC was based on E-resources and portals for research and crafting effective CV with high visibility to job portals.

Valedictory session was conducted to mark the end of this 5-day programme. NITTTR coordinator interacted with all the remote centers. Participants from MSIT shared their experience and feedback regarding informative sessions conducted during all the sessions. The programme ended with a vote of thanks to the organizers.
