On 22nd August 2024, the students of the IT –E branch from Maharaja Surajmal Institute of Technology visited the Atal Incubation Centre (AIC) at Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University (GGSIPU). The visit aimed to provide students with an in-depth understanding of startups, innovation, and the opportunities available in the entrepreneurial ecosystem.

Her session was particularly insightful for students interested in safeguarding their innovative concepts.

The highlight of the visit was the interaction with three founders of startups incubated at AIC. Aniket Sir discussed his startup, Lashkarr, which offers customized products at competitive prices. Shailesh Sir introduced EDEMS, an e-learning platform providing courses in web development, AI, app development, and internships. Lastly, Rahul Verma, a student from MSIT, presented LittleMove, a startup focused on enhancing school transportation safety through real-time tracking and seamless communication between schools and parents.
