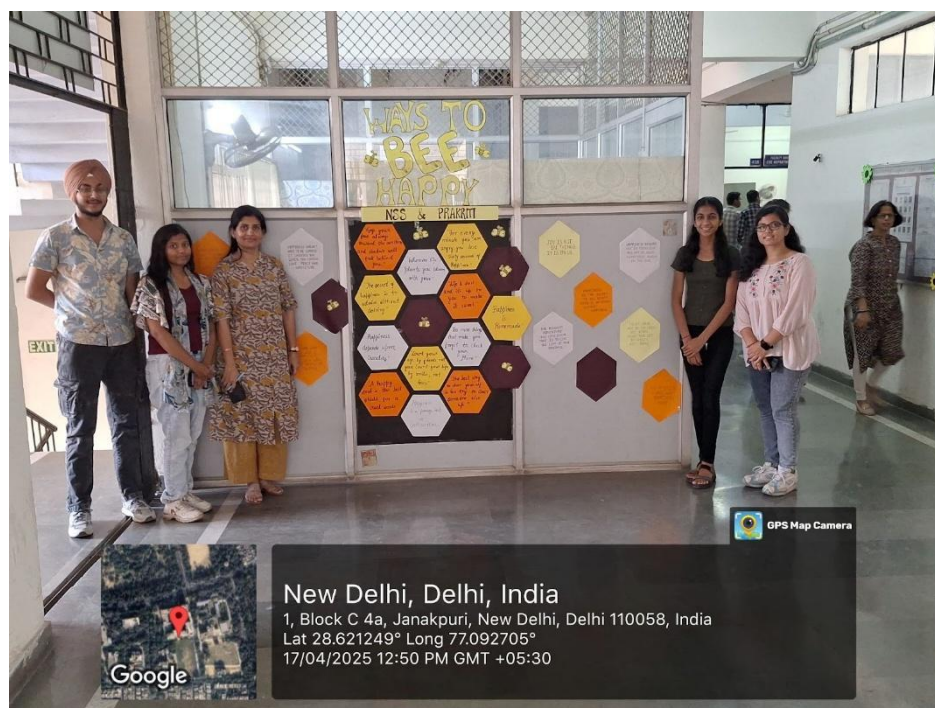
Happiness Corner 17th April 2025

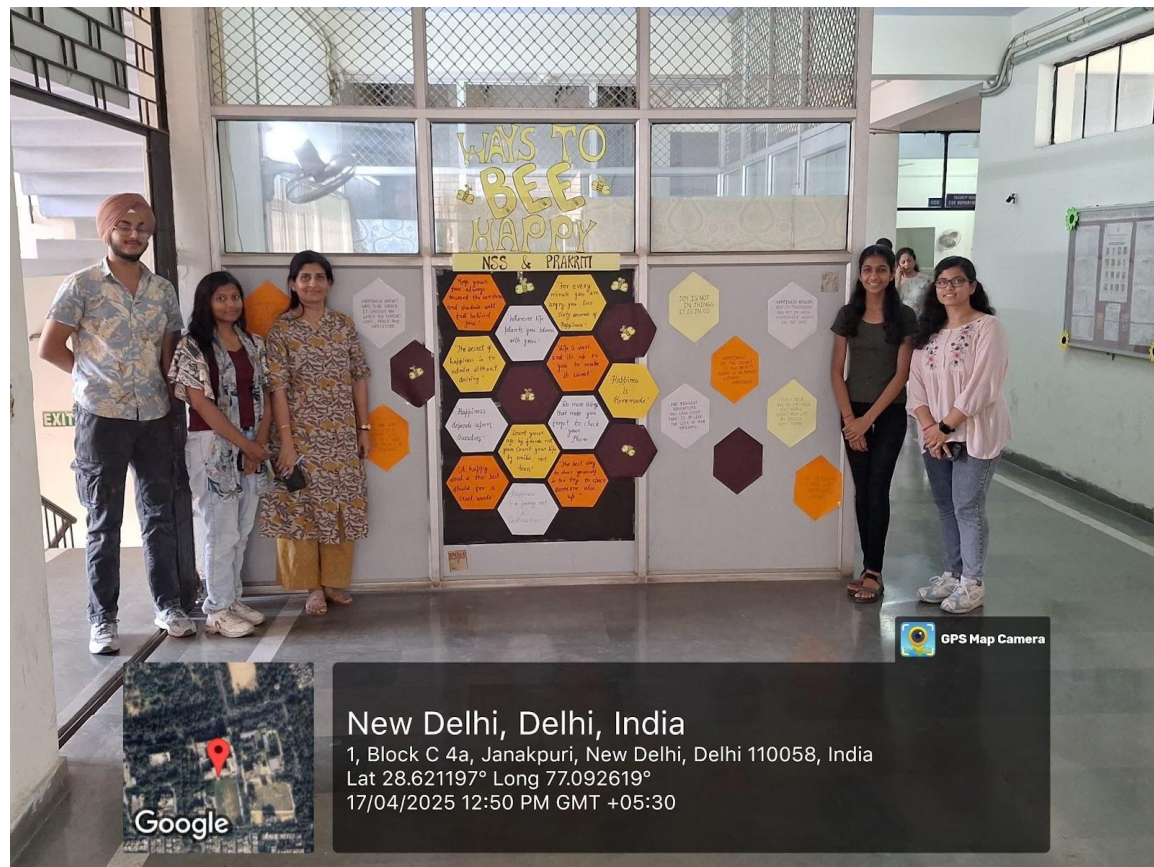

Event Overview

On 25th April 2025, Prakriti MSIT, in collaboration with the Rotaract Club of Delhi South East and the Rotary Janakpuri, NSS MSI, organized an impactful Blood Donation Camp and Health Camp 2.0 within the college premises. The primary aim of the event was to strengthen public health initiatives, raise awareness about the importance of voluntary blood donation, collect blood units for medical use and promote preventive healthcare among students, faculty, and the community at large.

The camp was conducted from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM in the auditorium, which was beautifully decorated for this flagship event using balloons, cutouts and banners. Throughout the day, students and faculty members came forward to donate blood as well as indulge in various health screenings to take care of their overall well-being. A dedicated team of 120 NSS MSI volunteers along with medical professionals worked tirelessly to ensure smooth coordination and execution of the event.

support greatly contributed to the overall success of the event.

Event Timeline

9:00 AM :- Medical teams, specialized doctors, and volunteers assembling to set up the venue and ensure that all equipments and safety measures were in place.

10:00 AM :- Registrations for both blood donation and health checkups began, where volunteers managed the documentation process efficiently, creating an organized and friendly environment for all participants.

10:30 AM :- The spirit ignited as the first donor stepped forward, symbolizing the beginning of a collective effort towards saving lives. Donors came forward one by one, committing themselves to this noble cause as they were comfortably assisted by doctors and nurses in the process of Blood Donation. The blood units collected would be used in future to support critical patients in medical institutions.

Throughout the day, alongside blood donation, the Health Camp also took place, where specialized doctors provided free-of-cost consultations and basic medical screenings. About 150 people, including students and teachers availed these health services, emphasizing the significance of preventive care and early diagnosis.

Maintaining the highest standards of hygiene and safety was a top priority. All medical procedures were conducted with proper precautions, ensuring a clean and secure environment for every donor and participant. The coordination and discipline volunteers also played a major role in smooth conduction of the event.

Conclusion

By the end of the day, the event successfully collected over **150 units of blood** and completed about **150 health checkups** and consultations by specialized doctors.

The Blood Donation Camp and Health Camp 2.0 organized by NSS MSI showcased the remarkable outcomes that can be achieved through collective community action, fostering greater social service and health awareness among people.
